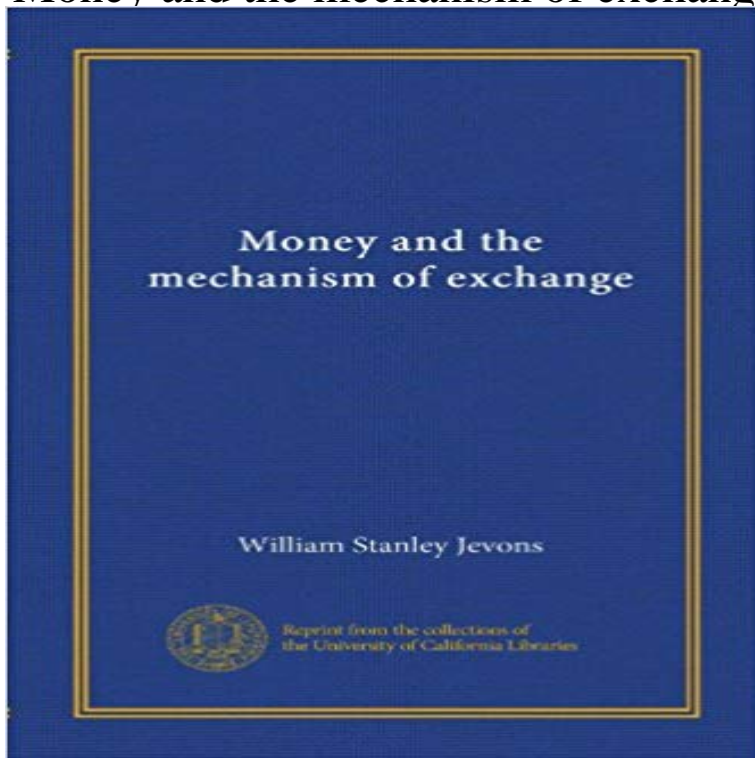


## Money and the mechanism of exchange
